# **Tips on Roses from Tammy Felloon**

'Roses are the most winning of plant packages in terms of their physical appeal, colour, scent, form and abundance. With many varieties offering repeat flowering qualities and an easy care plan they are perfect for all gardens.'

As bushes, roses are ideal in borders – for maximum impact, group two or more together. They can be grown over walls, fences and buildings as climbers and ramblers. You can even train them around doorways - iconic of a Devonshire cottage. There are also very hardy roses (*Rosa rugosa*) which may be grown as flowering windbreaks in coastal or otherwise exposed locations.

Whilst dwarf roses are perfect for growing in pots, make sure your pot is deep, because roses have long roots.

Roses like growing in sunny positions, but don't let their roots dry out, especially as they are establishing in a new place. Add the product *Rootgrow* when planting, as this contains mycorrhizal fungi,

proven to create a secondary root system for your rose that is more efficient in delivering nutrients to the plant.



You may also choose to feed twice a year, just after flowering, and at the end of winter, as this will ensure best flowering and strong plants.

We are extremely lucky in Exeter to have a registered British Rose Grower on our doorstep. St Bridget Nurseries in Old Rydon Lane have grown roses for over 90 years and from the 15<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> June will be celebrating the garden rose in their Exeter garden centres.





### **Community Garden**

Raspberries, pak choi, tomatoes, swiss chard, strawberries, and much more were grown in the community garden last year. The first garden produce sale took place last August.

# **Update on River Plate-Omaha corner**

At the beginning of October 2018, every home in Newcourt received a leaflet inviting residents to sign a petition to Devon County Council - 'Vote for community safety' [i].

This initiative, aimed to bring about change to the dangerous bend where River Plate Road meets Omaha Drive, received over 500 votes!

Devon County Council have assured us that they are working on improving this situation. So far, double yellow lines have been painted on the bend and DCC have done 3 days of videoing, which are being analysed, and we wait to hear the results.

Eight months on, the issues in the petition still remain:

• The corner is unsafe. There is no widening at the bend.

 The children's play area slopes down to the road and has no effective safety fence.

- Motorists approaching the junction have poor visibility because of fixed parking bays and buildings close to the road.
- Buses and heavy vehicles meet head on.
- There is no safe crossing for pedestrians; and lack of pavements around this critical junction.

We are indebted to the initiatives and input on this project from a

Newcourt resident – who is himself a Highways Engineer.



We hope to see some resolution of these issues this year, with the help of Councillor Andrew Leadbetter.

# **Sandy Park**

It's been another memorable season for Exeter Chiefs, who have reached the Gallagher Premiership Final for a fourth successive year, tackling the mighty Saracens at Twickenham.

Rob Baxter's side have established themselves again as a leading force, both within the English game, and also on the European stage, where they continue to mix with some of the biggest club sides in the Northern Hemisphere.

emisphere. At Sandy Park, over 200,000



supporters have attended across the sixteen home games, ensuring an average game-day attendance of 12,000 spectators. Much of this has been down to a record-breaking year of season ticket sales.

As the region's premier sporting club, the Chiefs have not only delivered on the field, but off the field, with rugby enthusiasts regularly returning for their fix of top-class rugby.

With the Rugby World Cup in Japan later this year, the Chiefs will again be on the world map with a large nucleus of the club's first team venturing to the Far East.

Sandy Park Hotel is the next stage in the development plans of Exeter's award-winning Sandy Park complex.

In addition to 250 bedrooms, the eight-storey hotel on Old Rydon Lane will provide leisure facilities on the ground floor, and a rooftop cocktail bar and restaurant, with picturesque views along the River Exe Estuary.

# **Persimmon Homes Fire Safety Barriers - UPDATE**

If you haven't had your home inspected for fire safety barriers, then chase Persimmon and get your home checked urgently, asking "please check my home for fire barriers in any and all locations they are meant to be fitted, according to building regulations."

At a recent meeting, Dave Jenkinson the new CEO of Persimmon Homes agreed that the issue of the lack of fire barriers in Persimmon-built houses was a major problem.

He added that Persimmon Homes were going to check 50 homes on each development, and if those all passed, they would assume that the rest would too. This was not acceptable, so Mr Jenkinson agreed to issue a letter inviting occupants of ALL timber-framed homes across the UK to have inspections done. The agreed letter was not sent.

So the BBC Watchdog programme was provided with



all the information needed for their report into fire barrier issues. A massive impact was had at last, and Persimmon then issued an email address for anyone wanting an inspection: firebarriers@persimmonhomes.com

Many Newcourt residents have had their roof checked, but if you haven't, do it now.

Once your home has been checked, ask Persimmon for a letter of compliance to keep with your insurance documents, and feel safer in your home.

The Parks Department at ECC have advised the NCA that the most effective way to reduce the problem of dog poo is to use pavement stencils and highlight the poo with chalk spray paint.

# **Defibrillator for Newcourt**

### For every minute that passes in cardiac arrest, a person loses a further 10% chance of survival.

Some residents have suggested Newcourt should have a community defibrillator, a device used to give an electric shock to help restart a patient's heart when they are in cardiac arrest, to increase their chances of survival. This would cost approximately £2200.

We will be fundraising for a defibrillator and for adult and child first aid sessions at community events this year, including at the brand new Well-being Festival on 21<sup>st</sup> September. Please contact Emma if you can help with any of the following:

# Neighbourhood Policing - PCSO Anthony Keller

The neighbourhood team have been busy over the last few months with a number of priorities across the city. These included a spate of antisocial behaviour from a group of youngsters in the City Centre, spreading out into residential areas.

Our focus has been on targeting problematic individuals and diverting them away from crime. ASB takes up huge amounts of our time and can have a big impact on our communities if left unchecked.

There have been many successful and attempted thefts, burglaries and break-ins recently in Newcourt, Digby and Topsham areas. These have happened at all hours of day and night, mostly targeting insecure doors, windows and vehicles.

In some cases, keys, and subsequently cars have been stolen from driveways. Despite the offending group being identified, it has highlighted the number of vulnerable properties in the area.

Happily, we have managed to apprehend and imprison the culprits for the Newcourt burglary series.
