From the NCA Chairman

Dear Newcourt resident

Welcome to this edition of Newcourt News, and a **special welcome** if you have moved into Newcourt this year.

It has been a different year for all of us. Some residents have experienced a really tough time, but there have also been many acts of neighbourliness, kindness and helping others. Support groups and the NHS volunteer programmes have been encouraging, so please do reach out if you're still struggling.

Personally, I had a career change in the autumn. I decided to make lemonade from lemons following redundancy and I've been training as a paramedic. It's been one of the most rewarding decisions of my life despite the challenges of starting a new career, and I'd encourage anyone to look forward instead of any other direction. I also tested positive for Covid in January; that's something I'd encourage everyone to avoid - but despite being left with an inhaler, at least I have an excuse to be rubbish at sports now!

I know I can speak for every resident, that we are thankful for the vaccination programme, and relieved that community-run activities (exercise classes, mums and baby group, community choir and so on) are beginning to start up again. We hope that 21st June will mean more opening up, and give more opportunity for new neighbours to get to know others.

Please note the Community Centre is open again, and looking forward to seeing you soon.

There are now around 1600 homes in Newcourt, with these areas being developed - The Green (Heritage) on the old golf practice ground; Seabrook Orchards on Dart land; and Sandy Park Hotel on Old Rydon Lane.

Nine years ago, when there were less than 300 homes, 72 residents met in the Plantsman's Café at St Bridget Nurseries. They decided to start a community association in order to help build what was then a very new community.

Involvement of residents contributing what they can

breathes life into a bunch of houses. This has been evident as Newcourt has grown. I want especially to thank Stephen Collier for his contribution as a trustee - who has recently stepped down.

Could you give some time to help continue to build this growing community? How could **you** help? There are openings for a few more trustees to represent different areas of Newcourt, and we could do with a secretary for the NCA. Seabrook Orchards

Whilst things are slowly starting to get back to normal, Seabrook Orchards is evolving.

Bloor Homes are continuing building Phase 2a (137 houses) following the completion of Phase 1 (200 houses) earlier last year.

We are extremely proud of Trinity Primary and Nursery School at the heart of this growing community. It's going from strength to strength, providing an outstanding learning environment for local children. Having helped to deliver the school with plenty of outdoor space, it provides a hub for the community and is available to local groups for activities and events.

The stream and wildlife corridor through the site will



be completed in June, providing ponds, wild flower areas, biodiversity nature trails and children's play areas. Grass, bushes and trees will provide a magnificent green landscape.

Through Seabrook Orchards, there is a web of world-class footpaths and cycle routes. Check the new community noticeboard on Dart Avenue for up-to-date information on travel and events.

In addition, we are planning

some bike-focused events with the Bike Shed in Exeter, to help with riding safety and bike maintenance.

If car travel is essential, residents can take advantage of the soon-to-be installed on-site Electric Car Club, or get involved in the Car Share initiative. For budding cyclists there is always the option to hire an Electric Co-Bike too!



Trinity School

This term, school children have been doing a sustainable food project, helping them learn where food comes from, the impact on the planet and how to eat more healthily, cooking from scratch. We received an encouraging video message from Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall, congratulating us on our approach to food education.

As residents of Newcourt, you are welcome to volunteer at the school. We keep bees, have a forest school, grow vegetables, chickens, a library, and love exploring diversity. Training can be provided if needed. We would love neighbours to read to children, help them garden or get involved in cultural

celebrations. Get in touch if you would like to join in.



Over the summer holidays, the temporary entrance road to the school in Vernon Crescent will close, and the main entrance will be opened. This should alleviate much of the issues with parking and access.

The school continues to grow, with another entry year coming up. In September there will be 300 children, and 50 staff.

Link your bin with a rubbish collection and recycling project in one of the poorest places on the planet.

2 billion people in the world are living among mounds of rubbish because they don't have their waste collected and disposed of safely.

With no waste collection. residents have no option but to dump or burn their rubbish. So it either gets added to open dumps, thrown in waterways which lead out into the sea, or burnt. creating toxic fumes and air pollution - breathed in by local residents.

How does Bin Twinning work?

Donate £45 to twin your inside or outside bin with a waste rubbish collection & recycling project enterprise in Pakistan, Haiti, Uganda or Nigeria. Or it's £150 to twin a large bin, or commercial bin with a ground breaking waste project in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Bin Twinning uses that money to fund brand new social

enterprises that collect rubbish, dispose of it safely, and recycle as much as possible. Many of these projects upcycle waste into items for sale - from compost to paving blocks - and proceeds are ploughed back into community development. All these projects create dignified jobs for society's most vulnerable people.

So, twin your bin with Uganda, and you'll twin with a recycling enterprise in Masaka. They are setting up three paving block factories to recycle up to 30 tonnes of plastic each month. These factories employ 90 fulltime workers, provide a decent income that is more than twice the local average. Half the staff team are disabled; half the managers are women.

With Bin Twinning, you are part of a vital trio:

- Saving lives
- Protecting the planet
- Creating jobs

LYN Love Your Neighbour • community food boxes!

You'll find LYN Box 1 in the right-hand side passage of Newcourt Community Centre, behind the high brick wall. And LYN Box 2: at Trinity School - to the left of the main entrance.



Community volunteers fill these boxes with surplus food items from local supermarkets.

The largest collection is Sunday evenings from M&S, so usually lots of lovely fresh bread and yummy things are added then. Other smaller collections are added through the week.

As it says on the box lid: 'Whatever your reason, please help yourself and in turn, help minimise food waste.'

LYN volunteers do their best to remove any items that go past their 'use by' date. But please follow advice on the box to check all products before consumption. Any items taken, are done at your own risk.
